

Travel information

The Methodist Church Centre on Gracious Street is in the centre of Knaresborough just behind the bus station where buses stop from Harrogate, Wetherby, Boroughbridge and Ripon. It is about 10 minutes' walk from the railway station which is on the York-Harrogate-Leeds line. There are two municipal car parks behind the church (Chapel Street and Fisher Street - both maximum 4 hours maximum) and a cheaper all-day car park in York Place about 5 minutes walk from the church.

Hot and cold drinks will be provided, but please bring your own sandwiches. Alternatively you can purchase food in nearby shops, and there are plenty of cafés and a fish and chip restaurant in the town centre very close to the church.
